

Slightly later than mid-season flower, large, smooth, consistent deep yellow trumpet.

Div. 7 Jonquilla

Jonquilla and Apodanthus Daffodil Cultivars. Characteristics of Sections Jonquilla or Apodanthi clearly evident: one to five (rarely eight) flowers to a stem; perianth segments spreading or reflexed; corona cup-shaped, funnel-shaped or flared, usually wider than long; flowers usually fragrant.

7O-R **INDIAN MAID**, M (W. G. Pannill) U.S.A. Jezebel x N. jonquilla [B33-1]. (76mm)

The perianth of this flower is a deep old-gold verging on orange. The segments are broadly ovate with the margins slightly incurving. There are usually 2 to 3 flowers per stem.
